B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Articulation with LaGuardia Community College (LaGCC) Associate of Arts (A.A.) in Communication Studies and New York City College of Technology's Bachelor of Science in Health Communication is based upon the following:

- Transfer students must apply for admission into the Bachelor of Science degree per the programmatic application process described in the college catalog and college website.
- Students wishing to transfer under this articulation agreement must have obtained their associate degree and met the minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA requirement.

Students who wish to transfer but do not meet all of the above requirements or are unable to enroll within two years after graduation will receive admission consideration under our standard transfer credit policies.

Articulation with the LaGCC A.A. in Communication Studies with the NYCCT's B.S. in Health Communication is based upon the following:

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60 Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60 Total credits required for the B.S. in Health Communication: 120

C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

Transfer credits will be applied to the baccalaureate degree as course specific transfer credits and electives. Students will meet with an advisor who will review their transcripts to ensure appropriate placement within the program.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by representative from each institution's respective departments or programs, selected by their Chairpersons and/or program directors.

Procedures for evaluating agreement (i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success):

Each year, NYCCT will provide LAGCC with the following information: a) the number of LAGCC graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of LAGCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of LAGCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at NYCCT.

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.): This articulation agreement will be publicized on the LAGCC website and on the NYCCT website. Transfer advisors at LAGCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
